

Chairman's Message

Introduction

ITRHD has now entered its 12th year. When it was set up in 2011, without any finances, what sustained us during the initial period was the spirit of optimism on the part of our founding Trustees and our initial individual and corporate Members. In the course of time we earned confidence in our expertise on the part of some State Governments, the Government of India and some corporates, in areas relating to conservation of rural heritage, our innovative approach to development plans for the rural sector, and our ability to mobilize community involvement in our objects.

We soon witnessed really gratifying results, and were able to launch diverse projects in 8 States of India. We have every reason to be proud of what we have been able to achieve. The malignant forces above, however, it seems were jealous of our success and launched the fearful covid attack, which resulted in a temporary setback to our activities. The flow of funds from different sources stopped, prospective corporate donors were suffering losses themselves and were not able to provide the CSR funds that we had been confident of receiving, and project proposals submitted to possible new donors remained unanswered. This put a brake on the flow of funds and a severe crisis was on our hands.

A silver lining in this time of crisis was a Corpus grant of Rs 5 crores from the Ministry of Culture. Under this, however, only the interest from the grant can be used for projects as approved under guidelines. Usage of these funds for administrative expenses was specifically debarred.

No organisation, particularly an NGO, can hope to deliver on its promises without administrative support. We meet the situation in the case of projects funded by CSR by reserving 10% of grant funds for administration. With the stoppage of new funds during the covid crisis, and the restrictions on the new corpus grant,

however, we were thus not able to meet even the modest salaries of staff and other administrative expenses.

We have had to resort to strong cost cutting measures, including giving up our rented office and moving staff into our personal flat in Nizamuddin. We have also transferred some of the staff to projects from where they can draw their salaries.

These measures provided a life line to our ongoing projects and offered some opportunities for taking up new ones. The challenge of meeting our administrative expenses, however, remains and all efforts are being made to locate new donors under CSR, and to convince additional State Governments to entrust to us some of their projects. Increase in different categories of membership would also add to our resources.

It is in this background that I make this appeal to all our friends and well-wishers, and all those who are concerned about preservation of our rich rural heritage and are willing to join us in continuing to explore the ways this heritage can provide a more secure future for our rural brethren. **Please do lend us your helping hand in identifying donors and suggesting volunteers and interns for our projects. I have no doubt that based on our track record you will come forward to join us in our mission.**

Our Activities- Support to Craft and Music Traditions

Our ongoing activities primarily relate to ensuring the sustainable survival of craft and music traditions which were in danger of dying out.

Our initial focus was on three villages in Azamgarh district (U.P.), all with rich traditions. The unique black pottery of Nizamabad and the silk weavings of Mubarakpur were in dire need of marketing support as they were at the complete mercy of middlemen; our intervention brought about a sea change. We organised in Delhi and later also in Lucknow what came to be known as Azamgarh Festivals, where at well-known and centrally located venues the craftspersons were able to sell their products to appreciative buyers willing to pay for the excellence of the products. All expenses relating to travel, board & lodging, venue costs and publicity were taken care of by us (through sponsors); all proceeds went to the craftspersons. The results were staggering. The crafts secured new recognition – in fact, Prime Minister Narendra Modi selected some pottery items from Nizamabad for presentation to the Prime Minister of Japan. Interaction with the buyers led to fresh ideas in diversification of products, and modification of design to meet changing market trends. The standard of living and the quality of life in these villages has changed beyond recognition during these last ten years. The saris of Mubarakpur were earlier marketed as Benarsi saris. Now they have recovered their former distinctive identity.

Another interesting discovery in Azamgarh was that Hariharpur village had the unique distinction of a long standing (400 year-old) classical music tradition, but had not received contemporary exposure. This was a challenge which had to be met. Their accomplished musicians, many of them very young, were invited to join the Azamgarh Festivals where they performed before appreciative audiences, and have now come to be recognized as the Hariharpur Gharana.

After nearly a decade of supporting the traditions of the Azamgarh villages, we felt that the time had come to expand into other areas as well. A preliminary survey by our team, led by Maharaja Gaj Singh of Jodhpur, made us realize that Rajasthan's Barmer region had a rich and vibrant tradition of folk music, crafts, and architectural heritage, as well as unique flora and wildlife. Much of this rich heritage was not well-known, and the younger generation was losing much of the skills. By including this region in ITRHD's overall development plans, we realized that a real change could be made in the lives of residents.

Things happen when the time is ripe and when favorable circumstances emerge. This happened when Hindustan Gum & Chemicals (part of the Harsh Lodha group) agreed to finance a crafts project in Barmer under their CSR program. We took the opportunity, and under the leadership of ITRHD Trustees Maureen Liebl and Amrita Singh, with guidance from Maharaja Gaj Singh, and ably assisted by a local consultant, projects were drawn up and implemented. We have had considerable success in organizing workshops for young residents of traditional craft villages, introducing the crafts to new audiences through exhibitions in Delhi and in Jodhpur's Mehrangarh Fort during international festivals, and supporting various environmental initiatives. In addition, we embarked on a slightly "revolutionary" path with music. The unique music traditions of the region have achieved international recognition, but they were limited to the male members of the communities. Holding our breath, we organized intensive workshops for young women in two of the villages. To our great satisfaction, not only did the participants really appreciate the initiative, but even the male members of the music communities supported it. HG&C have been very sensitive patrons, and have just given support for the next phase of the Barmer project.






Conservation of Architectural Heritage

One of our strengths is the expertise that we have in the field of architectural conservation. In recognition of this fact, the first project that fell in our lap related to the conservation of a historic 700-year-old Dargah in Haryana with substantial funds provided not only by the Haryana Government, but by other agencies such as ASI and the Haryana Waqf Board. The work has successfully been completed to the satisfaction of all concerned. If more funds become available landscaping around the Dargah would add to its appeal.





The next to repose confidence in us was the State Government of Jharkhand which on nomination basis entrusted two major projects to us. The first was the restoration of the 17th-18th century terracotta temples in the unique living “temple village” of Maluti, at a cost of Rs 7 crores. The first phase has been completed and work held up during Covid has now resumed. In order to ensure that work is in keeping with prescribed standards there is constant monitoring by ASI and by a company headed by the leading conservation expert Abha Lamba. The second project relates to the conservation of a historic jail in Ranchi, in which the tribal freedom fighter Birsa Munda was incarcerated. The project was completed in record time of less than a year at a cost of Rs 9 crores. It is now to be converted into a tribal museum as desired by the Prime Minister.

The Telangana government also financed a project relating to the handloom village of Pochampally, for promotion of tourism. It involved the making of a documentary film, a coffee table book and recommendations for future initiatives.

At the invitation of the XVth Finance Commission, we submitted a presentation on all our activities. The Commission recognized the fact that in the field of conservation we had demonstrated impressive expertise, and a recommendation was made that 4 major projects in Punjab and Haryana, at a total cost of Rs 38 crores, should be entrusted for implementation to ITRHD. That was a big feather in our cap. Informal enquiries suggest that the GOI may not enable to provide the funds, but efforts will be made to persuade the State Governments to provide the necessary funding.

We had felt that in the long-term comprehensive documentation of our country's rural heritage resources would be the basis for planning future projects. In order to demonstrate to State Governments the details that would go into such documentation (such as photographs of the structures, their history, present state of preservation, materials used, and possibilities of adaptive reuse) a pilot project involving several villages in the Munnar Region of Kerala was completed. This led to the signing of an MOU with the UP Government in which we were asked to carry out documentation work in the villages of two districts -Ballia and Varanasi at a cost of Rs 9 lacs each. The work was completed and Reports forwarded to the State Government. We met the expenditure out of our meagre resources but we have yet to be reimbursed.

Rural Tourism

An MOU was also signed with the UP Government for preparation of a rural tourism project at a cost of Rs 15 lacs. That report was also completed and sent to the Government, but despite several reminders we have yet to be reimbursed.

These are some of the problems that NGO's have to contend with. It is also unfortunate that NGO's are sometimes looked upon with suspicion, when many of us are doing such commendable work for the upliftment of the rural community.

Academy for Conservation and Management of Rural Buddhist Heritage

This is a new project that ITRHD is planning. It was felt that an academy focusing on management of rural Buddhist heritage would be the first one in the country, and should also be able to attract trainees from countries with a Buddhist tradition. In order to carry the idea forward it was decided to organise an international conference at which issues relating to the Academy could be discussed and debated. A steering committee is being set up and the Gautam Buddha University has agreed to provide its facilities for the Conference. In addition, an organisation under the Ministry of Culture (IBC, the International Buddhist Confederation) has also agreed to provide full support. Discussions have already been held and suggestions received from some experts abroad. Some foreign diplomatic missions have also been contacted. Discussions with ASI are yet to be held.

Issues relating to subjects to be taken up at the conference and identifying experts requires immediate attention. We would be glad to receive suggestions from all those interested who would like to help.

Documentation of Folk Music and Patiala Cultural Festivals

A significant development has been the documentation of folk music from all over the country by a professional team. Details can be viewed and the recordings downloaded from the home page of our website www.itrhd.com

For the last few years, commissioned by the Government of Punjab, under the able guidance of Trustee Anita Singh we have been organising cultural festivals in Patiala exposing the local people and others from neighboring areas to performances by eminent artistes in the field of classical music and dance. These have been a great success.



Miscellaneous activities

These include programmes relating to involvement of youth in rural development and creating awareness about our rich cultural heritage; women's empowerment programmes, infrastructure development and community involvement.




In addition, primarily to create awareness and support related to social and economic issues, seminars, workshops and lectures are organised.

Publications

Every year since 2013, two prestigious publications have been brought out. Our in-house magazine, EXPLORE RURAL INDIA, carries articles on different aspects of rural life and culture from knowledgeable persons both in India and abroad so that experiences can be shared.

We have also published five special thematic relating only to the Indian scene, covering Traditional Cuisines of India; Oral Traditions, Myths & Legends of India Rural Sports and Games of India; Tribal Culture of India and Traditional Healing Systems of India.

All the above publications, in addition to our Vision Document and several specialized reports, can be accessed and downloaded from the website (www.itrhd.com). They have been very well received and have resulted in the image of ITRHD getting a big boost. This would not have been possible without the combined efforts of our voluntary editors, our publishers, the very large number of contributors to articles from India and abroad, and over the years the considerable advertising support provided by our well-wishers, without whose



help it would not have been possible to sustain the publications. Prem Prakash of ANI was generous enough to provide Rs 8 lacs that took care of the costs of two magazines, when times were difficult for securing advertising support.

Observance of January 30 as Rural Tourism Day, April 18 as World Heritage Day

Rural Development was very dear to the Mahatma and what better way to celebrate it than to focus on successful rural tourism projects and those with future potential. The success of rural tourism ultimately depends on integrated rural development programmes involving the community. Presentations have been made by Jose Dominic on his Heritage oriented projects in Kerala; by Steve Borgia in Tamil Nadu; by Pandurang Taware on Agri-Tourism; by Ambica Berry on ART ICHOL project in Madhya Pradesh; and by Rawal Kishen Singh Jasol on the potential of Barmer as a potential tourist destination.

Every year World Heritage Day is observed with eminent persons invited to speak on the occasion. Simon Molesworth, eminent Australian Barrister, heritage expert, and former Chairman of the International National Trusts Organisation (INTO), was the first speaker followed by then Vice President, Hamid Ansari, Sheila Dikshit, then Chief Minister of Delhi, and Maharaja Gaj Singh of Jodhpur.



Gundiya Nadi Project

Two years ago, a government school on the Jodhpur/Barmer border (village Gundiya Nadi, in Jati Bhandu panchayat) requested a very small grant from us to develop a botanical garden. Under the leadership of a dynamic young faculty member, they utilized this modest initiative to develop an entire series of programs for increasing awareness of environmental and ecological concerns among their students, the students' parents, and eventually the entire community. Impressed by this extraordinary passion, we conferred an award on the young educator, Shri Surendra Saran, and began looking at ways in which we could spread this achievement elsewhere.



The village has several water bodies, substantial grasslands, and is home to several kinds of wildlife. One of our Founding Trustees, Maharaja Gaj Singh of Jodhpur ("Bapji") has been the leader of our Barmer initiatives, and is especially concerned with trying to save the few remaining traditional "orans." This village does, in fact, have the unique asset of a surviving oran. Oran, a traditional system for conservation of biodiversity in Thar Desert of Western Rajasthan often have strong symbolic meaning, and are considered "sacred groves". We thus see unique potential in several areas, and are planning to develop the village in a comprehensive manner.

Primary Education

Rural Development presupposes provision of adequate educational facilities particularly for those who for economic reasons cannot afford to send their children to good schools. Also with an eye to the future and women's empowerment, the girl child must receive special attention.

Hariharpur village in Azamgarh district has a sizeable population belonging to the economically depressed classes who, along with members of the Brahmin community who are engaged in preserving classical traditions of music, live in harmony. Soon after ITRHD came into existence, in response to the strong pleas of the Hariharpur residents, it was decided to set up a primary school providing free education open to all classes (to bring about integration), with special focus on the girl child. Hot mid-day meals are also provided and all requirements of the children's books, uniforms, and regular health checks are taken care of. Initially starting in a rented building, with some support from a team of young international architects sponsored by the British Council a makeshift building with a couple of rooms sub divided came into existence. Subsequently, primarily with donations from abroad, construction work was begun on a multi-purpose hall which will serve as dining room with proper hygienic kitchen facilities. We are trying to find sponsors for additional classrooms, as with one class being added every year, there is a constant increase in the number of students. The present strength is around 100.

For day to day running of the school and meeting all expenditure, including payment of salaries, we appeal to our Members and friends to donate any amount they wish to every year. Rs 3000 takes care of one child for the year. That produces generous responses, but more funds are needed for expansion of activities. Proposals are being submitted for CSR support. It may be mentioned that the school receives no financial assistance from the Government.

Taking a long term view we are anxious that in times of difficulty the school should have resources to fall back upon. Consequently, a corpus for the school with an initial amount of Rs 22 lacs has been set up with an ultimate target of Rs 5 crores. This would enable the interest from the corpus amount to be utilised in emergency situations.

Some donations need to be acknowledged apart from those already mentioned for construction purposes.

Under Amazon Delivering Smiles Project, ITRHD received a grant of Rs 980,750 from Give India Foundation. The purpose of the grant was to provide tablets, docking stations, and accessories for the students. This enabled the purchase of 95 Lenovo tablets. To ensure effective use of these tablets ITRHD in partnership with another organisation bought licensed learning content (CBSE school syllabi) for these tablets and organised training for both the teachers and students at Delhi and at the school premises in the village. We are confident that this will facilitate digital learning as a means to transform school education in rural India.



Acknowledgements

The success that we have achieved so far as been due to the sustained and dedicated efforts of so many people. It is difficult to name all but some contributions stand out and need to be recognized.

First and foremost are our Trustees who have given of their time and their constant guidance. It was Bapji (Maharaja Gaj Singh Jodhpur) who collaborated with me in developing the concept, and from the beginning he has contributed his time and advice, and let us use his name, with great generosity. Our three Vice Chairpersons (Yogendra Narain, AGK Menon, and Maureen Liebl) have all been actively involved in different ways and their support has been invaluable. Kapoor (former Chairman of MMTC); Brahm Dutt, (former Secretary to Government of India) and Nagesh Kumar (Executive Director of the Institute for Studies in Industrial Development, formerly for many years with the UN in senior positions). We are grateful to them for joining us.

We sorely miss the cheerful presence of KL Thapar who was amazing not only with his freshness of thinking and innovative ideas but helped us out in difficult situations by his timely financial contributions. His was a towering presence. Earlier we had also lost three veterans, Francis Wacziarg, Ishwar Das and Has Mukh Shah, all of whom have left large voids. We remain grateful for their invaluable contributions.

Members of our Finance Committee and Executive Committee have kept us our toes and ensured that we are never out of line. We owe a debt of gratitude to them

Our Advisory Council members both in India and abroad contribute valuable guidance and support. They include Ramesh Chandra, Nayana Goradia, Tirlochan Singh and his wife Kanchan, and Track Systems(1)Pvt Ltd Chennai. ITRHD was fortunate in getting the unstinted support of two eminent professionals in the field of education to our primary school in Village Hariharpur. Rashmi Malik, Principal of Salwan Public Schools, is actively involved in developing our educational programmes and training faculty. Mondira Bharadwaj, former Principal of the junior wing of the prestigious Motilal Nehru School of Sports, Rai, has provided extraordinary assistance by training our Primary school teachers, including in her own home in Delhi.

Rajni Sibal, a former Secretary to Govt. of India and a well-known author has also been involved with our activities in an advisory capacity and has recently become a special invitee to our Finance Committee.

Swapna Liddle, historian and heritage specialist is also a person on whom we can depend for advice and guidance.

Archana Capoor our Member Secretary has also been a pillar of strength taking care of our finances and other activities.

Rajendra Sharma our Financial Adviser (formerly with the Tourism Finance Corporation of India) has been of immense help in times of crisis.

Sangya Chaudhary who was responsible for our publications and youth activities has been unable to continue due to other commitments. She was a big asset and is remembered fondly. To take over from her as Editor of the publications we were fortunate to get back on our team Asha Rani Mathur who was the first editor before she had to resign for health reasons. She has great professional experience behind her and her presence adds great luster. Special mention must be made of my long standing architect friend Shiban Ganju who is already among the doyens in the profession for giving of his time and personal attention to the problems relating to the construction activities of our primary school in Hariharpur. His personal site visits and his day to day interaction with the contractor has helped to get things moving when at one stage we seemed to have arrived at a dead end. His associate Prateek acting under his directions has also been very active. Preeti Harit a very capable young architect with ideas and innovative approach was associated with me in INTACH. While with us in ITRHD she very successfully completed the conservation of the Dargah in Haryana and did an immensely commendable job in documenting rural heritage in the villages in the Munnar region of Kerala and for the UP Government similar documentation in the villages of Ballia and Varanasi.

Another experienced architect Shaista Parveen has recently completed a comprehensive report for UP Government on a Rural Tourism Project.

A husband wife team of Pallavi D and Vipul Bhola have been working on an integrated programme for development of the Barmer region which would be the basis for securing CSR support.

Shaguna Gehlote was with us for some time as Director of HARTS responsible for advising them of field activities. Her stint was short but she established a good rapport with some HARTS. She had to leave us for an international assignment. In the field mention must be made of two HARTS whose efforts have produced results and whose contacts are invaluable. Shreedeo Singh from Jharkhand has been taking care of our conservation projects in the state and Yashovardhan is our man in Barmer. His contacts and interaction with crafts persons and others have been extremely useful. Zohra Chatterji, former Secretary to Government of India is now based in Lucknow and has been a useful link to the UP Government.

Geert Robberechts of Belgium was responsible for creating a Belgian chapter of ITRHD with activities centered around Rajnagar near Khajuraho, relating to the restoration of old royal gardens. The entire funding was provided by the Belgian Chapter. This project was continuing for the past few years but due to circumstances at home his Board he decided to pull out but would continue their association with ITRHD as an Institutional member. He also has promised to enroll members for ITRHD in Belgium. Geert has been a great support and a real friend. INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Members of Indian Trust for Rural Heritage and Development

Report on the Audit of Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **Indian Trust for Rural Heritage and Development** (the society), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2023, the Statement of Income & Expenditure and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the financial statements, read with other notes given thereto, give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India:

- i) in the case of the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Society as at 31st March 2023; and
- ii) in the case of the Income and Expenditure Account, of the deficit for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) issued by ICAI. We communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

Other matters

We report that:

- a) We have sought and obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- b) In our opinion proper books of account have been kept so far as appears from our examination of those books; and
- c) The Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
